Following the **Coman Tiebreak Procedure**

New for Adult Leagues.

In 2007, the USTA introduced the Coman Tiebreak procedure at its National events. The Colorado Tennis Association and the Intermountain Tennis Association introduced the procedure at the USTA League Senior Championships in 2006. The CTA's Adult Programs Committee unanimously voted in favor of implementing this procedure for all of the CTA local leagues as well as all of the District Championships in 2007.

Here is how the Coman Tiebreak procedure works:

The Coman Tiebreak procedure should be used as a set tiebreak (first to 7 by 2) or a match tiebreak (first to 10 by 2). Players will exchange ends of the court after the first point and every 4 points thereafter. This tiebreak procedure allows doubles teams to continue serving from the same side of the court as they have been doing throughout the set or match.
